Volunteer drivers are subject to higher insurance rates, simply because they provide rides to fellow community members.

Volunteer drivers are subject to income tax on the mileage reimbursement over .14 cents/mile.

Being an older adult who no longer drives is a reality for many Minnesotans. People of any age with disabilities may not drive.

Inability to drive due to limitations or the lack of a vehicle presents a serious challenge in accessing healthcare and cuts off participation in the community, leading to isolation and loneliness.

Some people can use public transit; others are eligible for Specialized Transportation Services. But for more than 77,000 Minnesotans—many of them older adults living in rural communities—these options simply are not available.
